Message From The President

Want to get to know me? ... maybe not... This is kind of my bio in a nutshell. LOL

I was born on an Air Force Base in Germany and shortly after we were transferred to Andrews AF Base in Maryland, where my dad soon retired. At the time of his retirement, my father also went his own way.

Not knowing what I was getting into, I went. We were in such a remote place, that most all the locals had never seen a white person, much less 19 of us! They would try to rub the white off of us to see if there was dark underneath and loved to touch our hair and skin. It was a life changing time for me. There was one young man also in the group, who I just couldn't get along with. We talked about how we seemed to clash (He just knew he grated on my nerves) and we vowed to commit to be friends. I guess it worked because when we got back to the states, we got married. We didn't even date. That was over 38 years, 4 children, and 5 grandchildren ago!!

When my first son was born, I became a full-time mom. And 3 more sons later, I decided not to go back to teaching other children in the school system, but to teach my own instead. So I home-schooled all 4 of my boys. Three of my boys have their master's degrees; Mechanical Engineering, Special Needs Teacher, and Religious Studies. One son is a master of welding, and holds many certifications.

Three of my 4 sons are married and have blessed me with 5 beautiful Grandchildren; 4 boys and 1 girl. The girl is so spoiled. \sim Paula

QUIP Project Bag Step One

QUIP is starting a new project that will be taught during the monthly meetings. Paula will be walking us through each step and teaching us how to make our own project bags.

The directions are being taught in three parts, and the project will be done at home, not at the meetings. This last month Paula taught part one. Please see a copy of the directions below.



For those doing the project:
The question of the zipper came up. Needed is a Handbag Zipper 15 1/2 inches or longer single-slide. Paula has a few different colors that you can buy one from her at the meeting for \$3. She also has the clear vinyl which she can give to those doing the project.



Large Project Bag - Part 1

MAIN FABRIC: Body Main (to be Quilted) 15" x 15"

LINING FABRIC: Body Lining (to be Quilted) 15" x 15"

SOFT and STABLE: Body Stabilizer (to be Quilted) 15" x 15"

- 1. Sandwich the Body Stabilizer between the Body Main (face up) and Body Lining (face down), aligning all edges; pin to join.
- 2. Quilt using a medium-length machine stitch. Quilt straight lines 1" apart vertically along the length of the piece or in a diagonal crosshatch grid design.
 - 3. Trim the quilted fabric to 13 1/2" x 13 1/2".
 - 4. Stitch all around the bag Body 1/8" from the edge to secure the layers, "sealing" the edges:

This completes Part 1.

Part 2 will be taught and the directions will be passed out at the November Meeting.


